RESOLUTION TO REQUEST CLINTON COUNTY TO HOLD AMENDING COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

At a regular meeting of the Township Board of Eagle Township, Clinton County, Michigan ("Township"), on the 25th day of March, 2023, at 11:00 am, Eastern Standard Time, the following resolution was offered by Clerk Briggs-Dudley and Supported by Trustee Strahle.

WHEREAS, Clinton County has engaged Giffels Webster to make an amendment to the Clinton County Comprehensive Plan (adopted June, 2022);

WHEREAS, Clinton County recently finalized an update to the Comprehensive Plan in June, 2022

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Summary states "Overall, the existing Comprehensive Plan and Future Land Use Map were found to still be very relevant, with some amendments, to match current and projected conditions and County policies.";

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Introduction states "The Comprehensive Plan represents the collective desires of County residents, business, and local leaders regarding development of the community over the next ten (10) to twenty (20) years.";

WHEREAS, the Eagle Township community is consistently providing feedback that they agree with the 2022 Comprehensive Plan as it stands and an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan is not their desire:

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Goal 2 Quality of Life Objective 1 states "Manage growth in the County to ensure development is compatible with township development plans and promote the phasing of high impact development to minimize its effects.";

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Goal 3 Agricultural Land Preservation Objective 4 states "Recognize and consider protection of prime, unique, and important agricultural lands in the County in development decisions.";

WHEREAS, the land being advertised as the Michigan Manufacturing Innovation Campus is currently designated as Agricultural Preservation on the Land Use Map in the 2022 Comprehensive Plan;

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan for AGRICULTURAL PRESERVATION states "Areas designated on the Future Land Use Map as Agricultural Preservation (shown as the color green) are intended to identify areas of prime agricultural land used for production agriculture, small farms, low-density (large lot) residential, agricultural related businesses and industry in order to ensure the conservation of agricultural resource lands of long-term commercial significance for existing and future generations.";

WHEREAS, the land being advertised as the Michigan Manufacturing Innovation Campus is currently zoned as A-2 General Agricultural District in the Clinton County Zoning Ordinance;

WHEREAS, the 2022 Comprehensive Plan Zoning Plan for A-2, General Agricultural District states "This district is established to support stable, viable agricultural operations. The primary use of the district area is considered to be agriculture. The regulations of this district are designed to conserve and protect farm operations";

WHEREAS, an amendment to the 2022 Comprehensive Plan less than 1 year after adoption should be closely examined as to why this is being pursued so aggressively;

WHEREAS, the Eagle Township Board is investigating local Planning and Zoning per numerous citizen requests;

WHEREAS, the Giffels Webster timeline is being fast tracked to adopt an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan forcing Eagle Township to fast track a decision on local planning and zoning;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Eagle Township Board requests Clinton County to instruct the consultant, Giffels Webster, to hold any further action on the contract to update the Comprehensive Plan until Eagle Township has had time to consider this important matter and makes a decision as to whether or not they will adopt an ordinance to create a Planning Commission Board AND alternately, a referendum vote for local Planning Commission is completed by December 1, 2023.

Andrea Polverento Planning Director As you may be unaware, in 2006 Watertown Township participated with Cities of Lansing and East Lansing, Delta Township and Delhi Township in funding the Pollina study. This study is what led to the eventual creation of Lansing Economic Area Partnership of which Watertown Township was a founding dues paying member. Watertown Township, since the late 90's has conducted its economic development activities, as directed by the township board via its professional staff, working in conjunction with the wants and needs of the community. As a result of this synergetic relationship, Watertown Township boasts a strong and diverse commercial and industrial corridor where businesses are eager to locate. The personal approach and seamless process we take with our potential companies is second to none.

Watertown Township residents have put their trust in their elected officials to act responsibly with regard to future development within its borders, and to ensure the development that takes place is first in the best interest of the township residents and is in keeping with the Watertown Township Master Plan.

The residents of Watertown Township have openly and repeatedly expressed their dissatisfaction at the lack of public engagement and transparency regarding LEAP's handling of the mega site proposed in Eagle Township and would not receive any engagement from LEAP positively at this time. Further, township residents have been vocal regarding the literature they have received directly from LEAP. It is hard for an agency to push its way into a community after disregarding the citizen's concerns as not worthy of their attention, even if it is being paid for by the county commission. The Watertown Township Board of Trustees and staff work hard for our residents and put the needs of the community first. LEAP insulted our residents when they expressed concerns regarding the preservation of highly productive Farmland by dismissing them as "backyard concerns," and therefore not worthy of LEAP's attention. It is very clear where LEAP's interests lie, and they are not concerned about the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and agricultural businesses who call this area home.

Watertown Township respectfully declines Clinton County's offer and suggests strongly, that the county in their contracts with LEAP, make it clear that LEAP focuses their efforts where assistance is requested.

The ZBA did not meet in March, they will meet in April to consider a possible variance request.

Enforcement

A complaint was received regarding a facility on National Parkway, staff is working with the Road and Drain Commissioners to address potential issues.

A complaint was received regarding debris in the road for a residential construction project, staff worked with the builder to ensure the site was cleaned up.

This month, staff sent letters to all active and/or recent zoning violations with information about the Dump Your Junk Day opportunity on April 22. We will pick up violation inspections and notices after Dump Your Junk Day.

Development

Staff has received an incomplete application for a potential development at the NE corner of Francis and Grand River. When a complete set of plans are received, that will be sent to the Planning Commission for consideration.

Required corrections for the Nottingham Fields Phase 2 expansion are underway. Staff is working with local agencies, the developer and contractor, and the township's engineer to address corrections to these issues.

The Franchino Mold expansion is ahead of schedule, with an expectation of completion this summer.

Staff worked with MPC Cashway Lumber to issue permits to construct a small gazebo to show potential customers of options.

Final occupancy was received by Triton/BRP for their 15,000 square foot factory addition. A home occupation permit was approved for the manufacture and distribution of freezedried foods.

ZBA

The Zoning Board of Appeals is meeting in April to review a side- and front-yard setback variance request on Herbison Road. This property has Looking Glass River frontage and is also affected by the Looking Glass River Overlay Zoning District. Setbacks from the river are not proposed for a variance. The 150-setback will be strictly enforced.

Master Plan Update

Staff has submitted additional edits to Giffels Webster. A revised draft has not yet been received, but given the recent Clinton County/Eagle Township master plan amendment process, and its potential impact on the southwest corner of Watertown Township, there is no rush. Staff attended the Clinton County Master Plan Amendment Open House hosted in Eagle Township in March.

Other

A residential construction project has required signification coordination with the building official, mechanical inspector, and others regarding a project on Cutler Road. Another residential project in Lakeside Preserve has similarly required coordination. Staff provided a newsletter article regarding the groundwater study, and resources for homeowners on well maintenance. A resource guide is being developed for the website, which will be posted in April.

Staff has been meeting with Forsberg Development regarding Nottingham Fields corrections, and coordinating with the Road Commission and SCCMUA regarding necessary activities. Manhole coring, materials/density testing and other activities are expected in early April, staff will be on site with other agency inspectors during this time. Staff fielded a number of meetings and phone calls regarding potential future development projects, especially in the Grand River area.

We've been trying to stay on top of all the possible development matters related to Eagle Township megasite. Staff is monitoring media reports, public notices, and the county master plan process at this time.

9. NEW BUSINESS:

a. Planning Commission Reappoint of Davis, Wiesner, and Ball

Motion by Clerk Brokob, seconded by Trustee Cooley, to concur with the recommendation of the supervisor and re-appoint Joe Davis, Beth Ball, and John Wiesner to the Planning Commission for a three-year term ending March 31, 2026. Motion carried.

b. Clinton County Area Transit System

MaLissa Shutt from Clinton Area Transit System (the blue bus) attended the meeting to provide the Board of Trustees with an overview of current services that the transit system can offer the community.

c. PA 116 Application – Edward Lonier

Farmland Agreement application #2023-0306-01 was received for enrollment in the State of Michigan's Part 361 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 Act 451 as amended, more commonly known as Public Act 116 with Edward Lonier for parcel 19-150-023-200-007-00, consisting of 74.04 acres on the south side of Clark Road in Sec. 23. The designation offers an income tax benefit to the land owner.

Motion by Trustee Madill, seconded by Treasurer Biergans, to approve the Farmland Agreement application for Edward Lonier for parcel 19-150-023-200-007-00 and forward the approved application to the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, the Clinton County Planning Commission, and the Clinton Conservation District. Motion carried.

10. BOARD MEMBER AND PUBLIC COMMENT:

Trustee Overton inquired about the status of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. Treasurer Biergans reported that the reporting is on schedule and the funds have been received. The obligation of funds is December 31, 2024, and the funds need to be fully expended by December 31, 2026. The plan is to use the funds for a new township facility.

Trustee Overton asked about the ongoing negotiations with Grand Ledge Public Schools on the purchase of Wacousta Elementary. Manager Tubbs said the school is currently obtaining an appraisal.

Clerk Brokob provided an update on changes and new requirements that will need to be funded and staffed to implement Proposal 2022-2. With the new constitutional requirement of 9 days of in-person early voting, it will increase the need for staff, inspectors, and supplies from three days in 2024 to thirty days! Granger is currently requesting a 60-acre section of the Grand River Landfill be reopened with vertical expansion. Email accounts will be provided to the trustees and supervisor (watertownmi.gov) so the board does not use their personal email for public purposes. Clerk Brokob also thanked the board and staff for supporting professional development.

Trustee Madill inquired about the status of tablets for the board members. Clerk Brokob will follow up on this.
