



Rebuilding I-69 from I-96 to Airport Road Clinton and Eaton Counties

2021-2023

What Is Being Done?

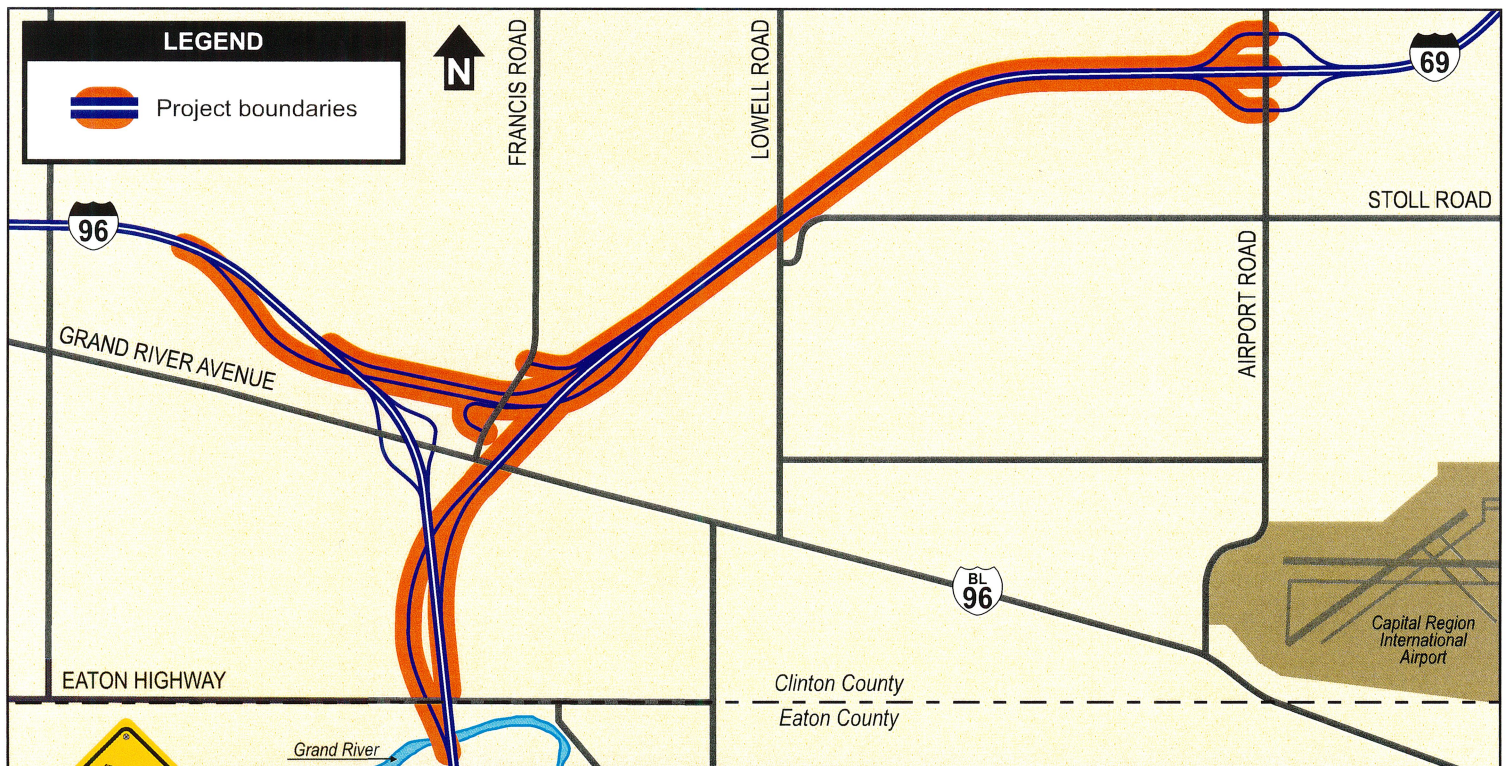
The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will invest approximately \$65 million to rebuild I-69 from I-96 to Airport Road, rebuild the interchanges at Francis and Airport roads, and perform preventive maintenance and repairs to 13 bridges between the I-96/I-69 interchange and Airport Road.

Funding for this project is made possible by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's *Rebuilding Michigan* program to rebuild the state highways and bridges that are critical to the state's economy and carry the most traffic. The investment strategy is aimed at fixes that result in longer useful lives and improves the condition of the state's infrastructure.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

The majority of work for this project will take place in 2021-2022, with additional bridge maintenance in 2023. Notices will be sent out about lane and ramp restrictions as work progresses.

Work in 2021 will require lane closures in each direction to allow crews to safely build temporary pavement and crossovers to use in later stages of the project. Also in 2021, the westbound I-69 ramp to eastbound I-96 will be closed and detoured. There will be alternating single-lane closures and ramp closures in both directions in 2022.
